Students receive a full refund for all courses and workshops cancelled by the college.







JOIN THE CALL TO NATIONAL SERVICE



ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

Introduction to Ladder Logic – Hybrid

The cost is \$499.

Learn basic ladder logic programming using ladder diagrams and basic electrical controls. Students will be required to meet in the classroom on Sept. 6 and Oct. 11 from 9 a.m. to noon. The remainder of the class will include online learning and in-person demonstration of skills as arranged by students and the instructor. FANUC – Handling Tool Operation and Programming

Learn the tasks that an operator, technician, engineer or programmer needs to set up and program a FANUC Robotics Handling Tool Software Package. Through manual controls and RAW capture, students will learn the craft of making photographs while being introduced to photo editing software. Emphasis will be placed on critical issues that pertain to contemporary commercial photography. This course runs concurrently with the credit course DART 110. Emphasis will be given to the importance of presentation and craftsmanship as it pertains to practical application of the real-world scenarios. Dealing with Difficult People





Restorative practices help to reduce crime, violence and bullying, improve human behavior, strengthen civil society, provide effective leadership, restore relationships and repair harm. When challenging behaviors do occur, having strategies to support students and help de-escalate are vital. Participants will learn about the verbal escalation continuum and strategies to support students in each phase.




