

Addendum
to the
Master Articulation Agreement
by and between
Ohio University and Montcalm Community College

This Addendum to the Master Articulation Agreement (“Addendum”) is entered into on July 1, 2026 (the “Effective Date”) by Ohio University (“University”), with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Montcalm Community College (“College”), with an address of 2800 College Drive, Sidney, MI 48885, collectively referred to as the “Parties.”

WHEREAS, University and College entered into a Master Articulation Agreement effective August 1, 2020 (“Agreement”);

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to supplement the Agreement to allow for students of the College to be eligible for articulated course credits at University; and

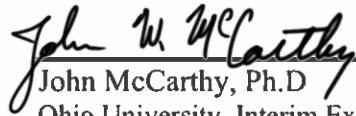
WHEREAS, the terms contained in this Addendum are specific to the degree program at each institution as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **Degree Program(s).**
 - a. College: **Associate in Science Degree Nursing (ADN)** (“College Degree Program”)
 - b. University: **Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN to BSN)** (“University Degree Program”)
2. **Term.** This Addendum will commence on July 1, 2026 and terminate on June 30, 2028.
3. The University Degree Program will be delivered in the following modality(ies): Online course offerings.
4. The College Degree Program is accredited by the following accrediting body/program certification: Higher Learning Commission, Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), and National League for Nursing Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (NLN CNEA).
5. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review this Addendum as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at that time.
6. This Addendum defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the College Degree Program into the University Degree Program. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Addendum does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.

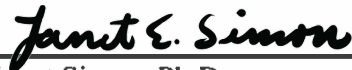

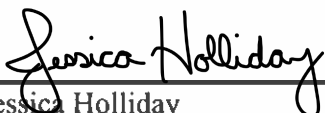

RN to BSN Online Program Pathway

The Ohio University School of Nursing RN to BSN program is designed for registered nurses (RNs) seeking to advance their education and career by earning a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). Balancing the demands of your career, family, and coursework can make campus attendance challenging. Our online RN to BSN program offers the flexibility to earn your degree on your schedule, wherever you are.

- Begin your RN to BSN courses immediately, regardless of prerequisite completion status.

Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission to the RN to BSN program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- RN Licensure Eligibility: Graduation from an approved program (or its equivalent) that qualifies you to sit for NCLEX-RN examination.
- Active RN License: Current, unencumbered registered nurse license in an Ohio University RN to BSN approved state. For a list of current states, please visit www.ohio.edu/chsp/nursing/rn-bsn/eligibility.
- Nursing Credential: Associate degree or diploma in nursing from a state board of nursing approved program.
- State Residency: Current residence in an Ohio University authorized state. For a list of current states, please visit www.ohio.edu/chsp/nursing/rn-bsn/eligibility.
- English Composition: Completion of the equivalent of ENG 1510 for full admission to the major; applicants without this prerequisite will be reviewed for a pre-major status.
- Academic Standing: Minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA from all prior college-level coursework.
- Official Transcripts: Direct submission of official transcripts from all previously attended colleges and universities to Ohio University.

Degree Requirements

To qualify for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, a student must complete all Ohio University graduation requirements: general education, college, major, and residency. You may have met many of these requirements during your previous nursing education program. Students must earn a minimum of 30 semester hours of Ohio University credit, complete a minimum of 50% of the nursing course requirements at Ohio University, and complete a minimum of 120 total semester hours for graduation (elective hours may be required). All students awarded a bachelor's degree Spring Semester 2029-2030 or after, must successfully complete (with a passing grade and pass the final exam) an American Civic Literacy course per Advance Ohio Higher Education Act (Section 3345.382).

Ohio University BRICKS General Education Requirements

BRICKS is Ohio University's general education program, and requirements must be fulfilled by all baccalaureate degree students. BRICKS includes a minimum of 38 credit hours across five categories: Foundations, Pillars, Arches, Bridges, and Capstone. Courses used to satisfy BRICKS requirements may be completed through Montcalm Community College or OHIO Online. The table below lists Montcalm Community College courses that have direct course equivalencies at Ohio University which meet BRICKS requirements. General education courses that may also satisfy program requirements are inside brackets.

BRICKS and Prior Degree Completion

Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Science (AS), or bachelor's degree from an accredited institution* prior to enrollment in a degree-seeking program at Ohio University will receive transfer credit equivalent to fulfilling Ohio University's BRICKS general education requirements in Foundations (excluding the Advanced Writing component, which requires completion of an equivalent course), Pillars, and Arches. Students who have not completed an approved degree will have their courses evaluated individually to determine appropriate general education requirement fulfillment. *Institutions must be accredited and meet OHIO's Transfer Credit policy to qualify.

Courses may be completed through Montcalm Community College or OHIO Online.
